

#### **Graham Brent to Retire from NCCCO Foundation**



Graham Brent, Chief Executive Officer of the NCCCO Foundation, will retire July 29, 2022, bringing to a close a 26-year career with the National Commission for the Certification of Crane Operators.

Brent has led the NCCCO Foundation since 2019 when he stepped down after 23 years as CEO of the National Commission for the Certification of Crane Operators. #### **Court Awards Judgement for Infringement**



A federal judge in Alabama has awarded CCO a nearly \$1 million judgment for copyright infringement, as well as a permanent injunction against the two defendants involved in the misconduct.

On December 13, 2021, U.S. District Judge Terry F. Moorer of the United States District Court for the Southern District of Alabama, entered a judgment against Donald Childers ("Childers") and his company, Alabama-based Nationwide Equipment Training, LLC ("Nationwide"), in favor of CCO. (The defendant is not related to Nationwide Crane

Training, based in Nevada.) The court found the defendants liable for "willful" copyright infringement of certain CCO written examinations. Read More

#### **CCO Revises Recertification Testing**

To improve fairness across all exams and candidates, the majority of CCO Exam Management Committees have elected to migrate away from shortened recertification exams, replacing them with the initial (longer) certification written exams to be taken by all candidates, whether for initial certification or to recertify as required every five years.



After careful study and analysis, CCO determined that the shorter recertification exams do not provide the same high level of reliability and validity that is demonstrated by the longer initial certification exams. All candidates, regardless of certification status, must be assessed on the same examination content as established by the Exam Management Committee. By using the same

exam for all candidates, this change levels the playing field and ensures that all candidates are tested equally. Read More



#### **Protecting CCO Exams**




One of the National Commission for the Certification of Crane Operators' ("CCO") most valuable assets is its intellectual property. In order to protect its intellectual property, CCO registers and enforces the copyrights it holds for secure examinations, score sheets, handbooks, and other examination materials. #### **Crane Operator Responsibilities and Requirements**

Fourth in a series of related articles reviewing the roles that have been identified when working with cranes, explaining the responsibilities, defining the training requirements, as well as outlining the documentation requirements.

As stated in our previous articles, the roles on the left side of the graphic are roles that do not have any requirements listed for qualifications (e.g. competent, certified, or qualified). The roles on the right side, however, do have prescribed qualifications and responsibilities.



The Crane Operator plays a critical role in the operation of the crane. Many believe that the Crane Operator is the captain of the ship and is responsible for all crane-related things. While this isn't anywhere near the truth, the Crane Operator does have significant responsibilities and qualification requirements. Read More

In February 2007 CCO unveiled plans to develop it's first nonoperator certification program, the Signalperson program. Aimed at helping to close the gap on workplace safety, the program launched the following year.

Today, 15 years later, employers, contractors, and those in the field rely on CCO certification of Signalpersons to help document that an individual has the knowledge and skill to perform their duties. Signalperson certification assists employers in meeting OSHA requirements, and has helped nearly **29,500 certificants** to be gainfully employed.
